23 Common Estate Planning and Probate Terms



- 1. Beneficiary: The person named in the Will to inherit the assets of an estate or a trust.
- 2. Custodian of the Will: The person who has the Will when the testator (see below) dies.
- 3. Decedent (or Deceased): The person who died.
- 4. **Decedent's Estate:** All the property (real or personal) that a person owned at the time of death.
- 5. **Executor:** A person named in a Will and appointed by the Court to carry out the Decedent's wishes.
- 6. **GPOA:** General power of appointment.
- 7. Heir: A person who inherits when there is no Will.
- 8. Intestate: When someone dies without leaving a Will.
- 9. Intestate succession: The order of who inherits property when someone dies without a Will.
- 10. Last Will and Testament: Another name for a Will (See below).
- 11. Legatees or Devisees: People who are named in a Will.
- 12. Personal Property: Assets like cash, stocks, jewelry, clothing, furniture, or cars.
- 13. **Personal Representative (or Administrator or Executor):** The person appointed by the court to pay creditors, taxes, and distribute the remaining assets to the beneficiaries or heirs.
- 14. Pour-Over Will: A Will that lists a Trust as its beneficiary.
- 15. **"Power of Attorney" (POA)**. Can refer to either a health care power of attorney or a financial power of attorney.
- 16. **Probate:** The process of deciding where, how, and to whom to distribute the decedent's property when there is a Will.
- 17. Probate Administration: The process of deciding where, how, and to whom to distribute the decedent's property through the probate court.
- 18. Real Property: Land and real estate.
- 19. **Summary Probate or Summary Proceedings:** An expedited process of administering a decedent's estate without going through the formal probate process. Only available in certain circumstances.
- 20. Testate: When someone dies leaving a Will.
- 21. Testator: The person who signs the will.
- 22. **Trust:** When one person (trustee) holds property at another person's (settlor's) request for the benefit of someone else (the beneficiary).
- 23. **Will**: A legal paper that lists a person's wishes about what will happen to his/her property after death. Also referred to as a Last Will and Testament.
